## **Wyandotte County Community Recycling Center 3241 Park Drive**

### **Glass:**

**Yes:** We accept food and beverage containers only. Glass needs to be separated by color: brown, colored, and clear. There are two different containers to put each color of glass in. Tinted glass goes with colored glass. One bin takes clear and colored glass while the second bin takes brown glass only.

**No:** Lids, metal neck rings or lead wine bottle seals.

**Hint:** Honey and canning jars will be reused; please set them aside at the Center.

### **Newspaper:**

**Yes:** Newspaper and newsprint only. Leave inserts in the newspapers. All newspaper and newsprint must be put into brown paper sacks or bundled and tied.

**No:** Plastic bags, paper or manufacturer's coupons. (see magazines)

### **Magazines:**

**Yes:** Magazines and thin catalogs with shiny pages throughout, manufacturer's coupons.

### **Mixed Office Paper:**

**Yes:** Office paper, stationery including fax-telex, receipts, file folders, any envelope except manila, mail including letters, pamphlets, brochures, greeting cards, utility bills, etc., posters, triplicate forms. Can be any color.

**No:** Carbon paper, tissue products, metal spirals, plastic spirals, rubber bands or manila envelopes.

**Hint:** Leave staples and paper clips. Envelopes with clear plastic windows are OK.

## **Corrugated Cardboard:**

**Yes:** Corrugated cardboard with a flat finish (non-shiny) and paper grocery bags only.

**No:** Excessive amounts of tape and staples; no paperboard (i.e. cereal boxes, etc.)

**Hint:** Flatten all boxes; fold and save clean paper bags for reuse. Oily, waxy, wet or moldy corrugated cardboard should go in paperboard.

## **Paperboard:**

**Yes:** Slick or flat finish non-corrugated paperboard packaging (soft drink, beer, cereal, gift and packaging boxes), paperboard rollers (paper towel rolls etc.), paper-fiber egg cartons, manila envelopes, telephone books.

**No:** Over wraps of liners; wrapping paper, tissue paper products or waxed products.

**Hint:** Please clean and flatten all packaging.

## **Cans and Plastics:**

**Yes:** We accept food and beverage cans only. Paper labels may stay on cans. All cans can be mixed together along with all the plastics. We accept only Plastic #1 and #2 plastic bottles and jars (they must have a threaded neck).

**No:** Plastic butter tubs, yogurt containers, or containers that held toxins (drain cleaner, automotive fluids, etc.) Toxins are any substances that can cause death or injury if eaten, inhaled or absorbed through the skin.

**Hint:** Please rinse and flatten cans and plastics.

### **Aluminum Foil Products:**

**Yes:** Clean foil products (foil, pie plates, roasting pans, etc.)

**No:** Food Residue.

**Hint:** Please keep separate from cans. Place in container near the Green Bin.

### **Household Batteries:**

**Yes:** Alkaline, rechargeable and button batteries accepted.

**No:** Lead acid or automobile batteries.

**Hint:** Place corroded batteries in a Ziploc™ bag.

### **Toner & Ink Jet Cartridges:**

**Yes:** Any rechargeable toner or ink jet cartridge.

**Hint:** Please bring in original packaging if possible.

### **Scrap Metal:**

**No:** Compressors, sealed units, microwaves, light fixtures, transformers, office machines, gas bottles, lead acid batteries, tires, electronics, or computers.
